To increase penalties for the commission of financial crimes using artificial intelligence.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "AI Fraud Deterrence
- 5 Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

- 8 (1) Scammers are using AI to impersonate sen-
- 9 ior U.S. government officials.

2	sonal cellphone of White House Chief of Staff Susie
3	Wiles and used AI to impersonate her voice in calls
4	and messages to senators, governors, business lead-
5	ers, and other high-level contacts.
6	(3) In July 2025, AI was used to impersonate
7	Secretary of State Marco Rubio's voice in calls to
8	three foreign ministers, a Member of Congress, and
9	a Governor, with the apparent aim of obtaining sen-
10	sitive information and access to accounts.
